MINUTES:

Scott Ward stated it would be a good idea to have signs put up when the roads are paved that says this road paved by C funds.

Sandra Gantt made a motion to accept Ordinance 16-25 for first reading. Denise Jackson seconded. Unanimous.

c. SECOND AND FINAL READING OF "AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE CORPORATE LIMITS AND ANNEX APPROXIMATELY .280 OF AN ACRE INTO THE TOWN OF PENDLETON, SOUTH CAROLINA AND DEFINE ZONING CLASSIFICATION." (Lin Gardens)

 Bruce Kalley made a motion to appoint Christine Tedesco and Pam Patterson to fill the two vacancies on the Planning Commission. Sandra Gantt seconded. Unanimous.
